Heartland Community College will be offering an ACE college class at Prairie Central High School for the Fall 2006 semester. The process for enrolling in an ACE class is simple. Here is some important information you will need to know:

Course: History 102 - Modern Western Civilization

Modern Western Civilization will be offered the first semester of the 2006-2007 school year. This course covers the development of the modern West in terms of the great movements of the past five centuries. **A Heartland Community College instructor will teach this course on the Prairie Central High School campus during the regular school day.**

Application: An application for admission can be obtained from your high school counselor or at Heartland Community College. Please return the completed application to your counselor.

Assessment: Assessment in Reading and English is required prior to enrollment in an ACE class. Assessment tests may be taken at Heartland Community College, 1500 W. Raab Rd., Normal or 511 East Madison St., Pontiac. **Note: An ACT English subscore of 21-36 exempts students from the English placement test. An ACT Reading subscore of 21-36 exempts students from the Reading placement test.**

Enrollment: Students are required to fill out an enrollment form.

Textbooks: Students are responsible for the cost of all textbooks used in an ACE course. Textbooks may be purchased at the HCC bookstore in Normal or can be ordered online at www.heartland.bkstr.edu. You may also order the book by phone at (309) 268-8220 and ask that the book be delivered to the Heartland Community College campus in Pontiac.

Tuition: Tuition is the responsibility of the student. Tuition bills will be sent in June and will be due in mid-July for the fall semester.

ACE Grants: The State of Illinois provides grants through the ACE program, which help pay tuition for students taking college-level courses while they are still enrolled in high school. Students receiving a "C" or better at mid-term will be reimbursed \$50. Due to the uncertainty of state funding, the ACE program may be altered at any time.
