## **Purpose**

This brochure is intended to provide parents and community members with a listing of important curriculum expectations which Unit District #8 has for its fifth graders. The lists do not contain all of the content or skills that Unit 8 students will be exposed to during a school year. A more complete listing is used by teachers to prepare lessons and activities on a daily basis; however this list should help parents and teachers as they discuss the academic progress of their children.

## **Curriculum Expectations by Content Area**

### **Language Arts/ Reading**

The student should be able to:

- Read with fluency at the fifth grade level
  - Adjust reading rate to purpose
  - Decode unfamiliar words (prefixes, suffixes, root words and context clues)
  - Read with expression
- Apply reading strategies to comprehend
  - Use glossary, headings and graphics
  - Self-question during reading
  - Re-read
  - Evaluate information
  - Develop vocabulary (homophones, multiple meanings, synonyms and antonyms)
  - Determine the main idea and details, setting, characters and point-of-view
  - Predict
  - Draw conclusions

### **Language Arts/ Reading (Cont.)**

The student should be able to:

- Plan and write a multi-paragraph essay while applying content variety, writing structure and editing strategies
- Write to clearly communicate
- Write using correct grammar, punctuation and spelling

### **Math**

The student should be able to:

- Multiply three-digit by two-digit numbers
- Divide with and without a remainder
- Add, subtract and compare fractions
- Calculate the area of a square and rectangle
- Multiply and divide with decimals (money)
- Apply basic geometry, algebra and measurement concepts
- Read, write, compare and round numbers up to 1,000,000,000
- Make and use charts, tables, and graphs

### **Science**

The student should be able to:

- Explain how machines work
- Explain weather concepts and patterns
- Explain biomes and their plants and animals
- Explain cycles in nature
- Explain matter

### **Social Studies**

The student should be able to:

- Demonstrate a literacy in United States history
- Explain the principles of geography
- Demonstrate appropriate map skills

### **Fine Arts - Visual**

The student should be able to:

- Identify and comprehend the art elements of line, shape, texture, value, color and form
- Identify and comprehend the art principles of balance, contrast, emphasis, movement, pattern, rhythm and unity
- Identify and describe how the arts function in society and everyday life
- Describe the similarities among the arts
- Describe, comprehend, and demonstrate proper use of materials and art techniques

### **Fine Arts - Music**

The student should be able to:

- Demonstrate an ability to sing expressively, on pitch, with appropriate dynamics
- Recognize the historical and cultural influence of music from Middle Ages to Renaissance time periods
- Recognize and demonstrate an understanding of music theory (Music Ace II)
- Identify, compose, and recognize characteristics of folk music from around the world

### **Media Center**

The student should be able to:

- Display a working knowledge of the Windows operating system (start button, program menu)
- Demonstrate the ability to utilize the Internet as a research tool, using appropriate search techniques
- Exhibit a working knowledge of Microsoft Word (standards and formatting)
