Minutes

The Board approved minutes of the April 18 regular meetings (#1 and #2), and the May 17 special meeting.

Ashley Hammack expressed concern that her son, a student with disabilities, is the frequent victim of bullying by other students; and that the staff is not addressing his emotional and physical needs either out of disregard or a lack of communication.

Executive Session

The Board entered executive session with the expressed purpose of hearing testimony regarding the performance of the Prairie Central High School girls' head basketball coach.

Personnel

Following executive session under 5 ILCS 120/2 (1), the Board announced that, due to the length of testimony in executive session and with an entire regular meeting's agenda remaining, it would not decide on the disposition of the girls' coach for the coming year; but instead, schedule a special meeting in the near future to deliberate further.

Consent

The Board approved the consent agenda, which included an activity fund report, booster purchases (including a wrestling mat), bills (current/interim), a cafeteria report, financial reports, an investment schedule, a sales tax report, and a treasurer's report.

Superintendent's Report

The Board heard the Superintendent's report in the categories of

- *ISBE/State of Illinois/Legal.* Categorical reimbursement payments from the state are arriving 6-7 months after disbursement. The state legislature continues to consider school funding reform, with a property tax freeze, an income tax increase, mandate waivers, pension reform, and workers' comp reform integral to the on-going debate.
- *Maintenance.* The Board toured facilities and grounds on May 17, while eyeing maintenance projects for the summer. It did not have time to follow-up at the regular meeting on its observations. As per Meadowbrook Elementary demolition, the Board will entertain an attorney at its next meeting who specializes in demolition-for-property contracts. The estimate for demolishing the building outright is \$203,900.
- *Budget projection, levy & extension.* Projections of June 30 end balances indicate the need for \$1,200,000 from working cash to restore the fund to positive; and \$600,000 to restore transportation. The Superintendent also reviewed the operating extension for the coming year, observing that the District can expect a 3.28% increase in property taxes in the coming year, or a total of ~\$340,000. He also expressed deep concern over a series of critical errors in the McLean County clerk's office regarding bond collections in the Chenoa area. Chenoans, essentially, have been grossly under-taxed, and, since all collections must be complete by the time the bonds are retired, they will face a considerable leap - well in excess of \$1.00 - in their bond rate next year to adjust for the glitches. There will likely be political fall-out.
- *Technology.* Administrators are contemplating ways to apply additional Title I funding to the expansion of technology.

- Authorized the letting of bids for a 47-passenger handicapped accessible bus to replace bus 16.
